A HISTORY OF THE DIOCESE OF BRENTWOOD (1917-1992): Over 200 pages plus maps and illustrations, published in 1994 to mark the 75th anniversary of the Diocese of Brentwood. After setting the scene in terms of the growth of Catholicism in Essex and East London in the nineteenth century, the book tells the story of the foundation of the diocese towards the end of the First World War, its development in the inter-war period and the difficulties endured during the Second World War. The rapid expansion of the diocese in the post-war period is then examined, followed by an assessment of the impact of the Second Vatican Council. The final covers the first twelve years of the episcopate of Bishop Thomas McMahon. Originally priced at £8, the book is now available for £5 post free (please make cheques payable to BRCDT).
