

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY

You are the Christ. The Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously

First Reading: Is 50:5-9

Responsorial Psalm Ps 114:1-6. 8-9

Second Reading: Jm 2:14-18

Gospel: Mk 8:27-35



TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY: Today's first reading and Gospel focus on the Passion. Isaiah prophesies that God's Servant will suffer but God will stand by him - a reading we hear on Good Friday. In the Gospel, after eliciting a profession of faith from Peter he warns that he must be put to death but will rise again on the third day. If we want to be his followers we must be willing to take up the cross and be willing to lose our lives for his sake. Down the centuries many Christians have done just that and in our own day many have been killed rather than renounce their faith, not least at the hand of ISIS. While most of ISIS's victims have been fellow Muslims, we must not forget the many thousands of Christians who have been killed or forced to flee. As well as offering concrete help we must pray for them and for those still beleaguered in their home countries. We must also pray that we would have the same courage and fortitude if our own faith were to be tested in this way. Two feasts this week pick up and continue this theme. Tomorrow we keep the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross - a reminder of how the relics of the True Cross, discovered by St Helena, were carried off by the Persians in the Seventh Century, but recaptured and returned to Jerusalem. The following day we honour Our Lady of Sorrows and reflect how her Son's suffering affected the Blessed Virgin Mary, and her compassion for us in our own sufferings.

REFUGEE CRISIS: Last Sunday's Angelus, 6 September, Pope Francis invited every parish, religious house and monastery in Europe to respond to the growing refugee crisis by offering a place of sanctuary to families fleeing from war and persecution in their home countries. The Pope calls on our generosity and solidarity to recognise and act upon our common humanity. The UK government has agreed to receive and resettle up to 20,000 Syrian refugees from the camps in neighbouring countries over the next five years. The Catholic Church in England and Wales will work alongside Government and local authorities to offer welcome and support to those in need. The refugee crisis is a huge challenge, not only in Europe and the Middle East, but in many others parts of the world where large numbers of refugees live deeply uncertain and perilous lives. Consequently, as a Catholic community, and as a country, we need to be committed to helping refugees over a long period. To sustain that effort we need moral imagination. We recognise that we can all contribute and play a part in helping to support the most vulnerable of refugees. Such assistance includes: Prayer, Financial support, Time and professional skills (e.g. language teaching, legal help, advocacy), Shelter and accommodation. We can all be attentive to those who are vulnerable and newly arrived in our local communities and parishes. A warm welcome can be the most simple yet effective of gifts we can all offer. Practically, we are working to ensure, as far as possible, that every diocese has a contact nominated to co-ordinate your parish/individual response; they will liaise with the local authority and other faith groups to match offers of time, talents and accommodation with the pressing humanitarian needs of the local area.
