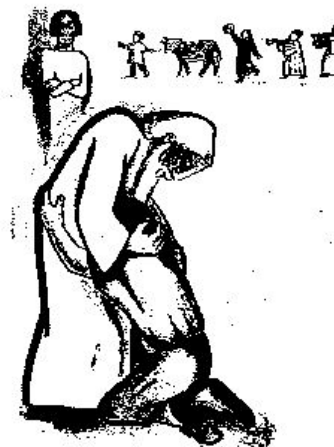

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Your brother here was dead and has come to life

First Reading	Jos 5:9-12
Responsorial Psalm	Ps 33:2-7

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: In our second reading today we hear St Paul's wonderfully encouraging words to the people of Corinth, "For anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here. It is all God's work. It was God who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the work of handing on his reconciliation." He continues by explaining how Christ took our sin on himself "so that in him we might become the goodness of God". Corinth was and is a port, and was a byword for sexual immorality. To the Greek speaking world it was like 'Soho' for Londoners, or the 'Tipperary' of the First World War song, which referred not to the Irish county but the red light district behind the Tipperary pub in The Strand! Whatever our past failings, if we allow him to, Christ takes our sin upon himself and set us free, wiping the slate clean. This is what the sacrament of reconciliation is about. Our confession is laying our sins on his shoulders, and in return we hear Jesus say, "I absolve you from your sins". We are created anew, as free from sin as a newly baptised child. Do take advantage of the opportunity to celebrate this sacrament before Easter, and particularly at our **Reconciliation Service**, which takes place this Wednesday at **7.30 p.m.**
