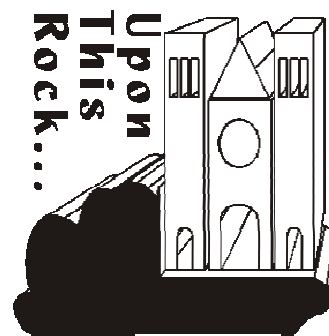

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF YEAR

*You are Peter, and I will give you the keys
of the kingdom of heaven.*

First Reading: Is 22:19-23

Responsorial Psalm Ps 137:1-3.6.8

Second Reading: Rom 11:33-36

Gospel: Mt 16:13-20



21ST SUNDAY: In bingo '21' is 'key of the door' – a reference to the time when people used to attain their legal majority and independence from their parents' authority. Keys and locks have been around for a long time. The basic principles of the pin tumbler lock may date as far back as 2000 BC in Egypt; the lock consisted of a wooden post affixed to the door, and a horizontal bolt that slid into the post. The bolt had vertical openings into which fitted a set of pins. These could be lifted, using a key, to a sufficient height to allow the bolt to move and unlock the door. Such keys were large and worn slung over the shoulder. Shebna and Eliakim were in effect the Prime Minister, able to act in the King's name. The disciples would immediately have understood what Our Lord meant by entrusting St Peter with the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven. This is why the role of the successor of St Peter is not simply a human organisational structure but part of our faith as Catholics. It is how we understand Our Lord intended to his Church to be so that there would be a human person entrusted with authority on earth to make final decisions in matters of teaching and discipline.

Zurbaran's painting refers to St John Houghton's last words as his heart was cut from his body, "O Jesu, what would'st Thou with my heart?" and shows the saint offering his heart to the Lord.
