## THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD



**NATIVITY OF THE LORD:** Warmest Christmas Greetings to all of you, and especially those who are visitors to our parish at this time! For many centuries the Church has provided three different Mass texts for Christmas. The first – that of Midnight – focuses our thoughts on Mary and Joseph and the birth of Jesus. The second – of dawn - allows us to share the reaction of the shepherds to the wonderful events unfolding in the village below them. The third – day Mass – takes a different approach. We do not hear the human details of the story but rather St John’s reflection on its meaning in the prologue to his Gospel: “The Word became flesh and dwelt amongst us.” For most people it is St Luke’s account read at the Midnight and Dawn Masses that touches the heart, but we need the counter balance of St John to understand the significance of Christmas. It is not simply a human drama about the birth of a baby, but a divine drama about God coming down to dwell in our midst and share fully in all that it means to be human. It is by taking on our human nature that God enables us to share in his divine nature through the gift of grace, and opens the way to heaven for us. The liturgical year telescopes the historical events into twelve days although we are not told how long after the birth of Jesus the wise men arrived. In England Twelfth Night is regarded as the end of the Christmas season, but in some countries the crib remains in place until 2<sup>nd</sup> February and the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple.

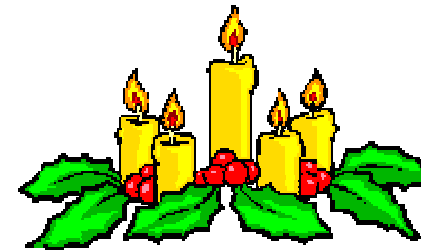
**FINANCE:** Offertory collection for **Sunday 18th December - £646.75.**

**MOVING MOUNTAINS:** Anglia Ruskin University would like to invite you to join us to hear Dame Claire Bertschinger, the nurse who inspired Live Aid, to give her inspirational talk 'Moving Mountains'. Following on from a successful nursing career in the UK, Claire's first post abroad was as a medic for the Scientific Exploration Society in Panama Papua New Guinea and Sulawesi. She went on to accumulate vast experience from many years working in emergency disaster relief, primarily in war zones, with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). She has worked in over a dozen countries including Afghanistan, Kenya, Lebanon, Sudan, Sierra Leone, Ivory Coast and Liberia. Claire's talk will be based on her autobiography 'Moving Mountains' in which she illustrates just how intolerable the situation in Ethiopia had become. Claire was awarded the Florence Nightingale Medal in recognition of her work in conflict situations, has gained a Masters in Medical Anthropology, and has published her biography Moving Mountains (Transworld, 2005) to critical acclaim. She has subsequently received Woman of the Year, Window to the World award, Human Rights and Nursing Award, and was made a Dame in the 2009 New Year Honours List for services to Nursing and to International Humanitarian Aid. After the talk there will be a 20 minute Q&A session followed with a drinks reception.
