THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Repent and believe the Good News.

First Reading: Jon 3:1-5. 10

Responsorial Psalm Ps 24:4-9

Second Reading: 1 Cor 7:29-31

Gospel: Mk 1:14-20



THIRD SUNDAY: A note of urgency runs through our readings today. Jonah delivers an ultimatum to the people of Nineveh - just forty days to repent and amend their way of life. St Paul warns the people of Corinth not to be too comfortable in their existing state of life "because the world as we know it is passing away". In St Mark's Gospel it is the recognition of the urgency of the Lord's invitation that leads Simon and Andrew, James and John to abandon their employment as fishermen, their homes and families, to join Jesus in his mission. Two thousand years later the world has not yet passed away and we can feel that there is no urgency about the call of Christ but we know our human lifespan is limited, even if we do not like to think about it very much. A few days ago I had a phone call from a former parishioner who keeps in touch from time to time - just a few days younger than myself. She wanted to tell me she had just paid off her funeral plan so as to spare her son the worry! Are we as prepared? More importantly, are we ready to meet God face to face or are there things in our lives we would want to change first? Perhaps we should take a little more urgently Our Lord's words, "The kingdom of God is close at hand". It is Good News but also a challenge to be ready. God may have given us many more than forty days' notice, but can we presume on this?

To apply for the Catholic Parliamentary and Public Policy Internship scheme you will need to have completed the Application form and provide two referees, one of whom should be your Parish Priest or University Chaplain and the other your most recent employer (paid/voluntary) or course tutor. Please note that it is your responsibility to ensure that your referees send your references directly to us before Wednesday 4th March, otherwise your application cannot be considered for short listing.
