

## Seventeenth Sunday of Year

Ask, and it will be given to you.

First Reading Gen 18:20-32

Responsorial Psalm Ps 137:1-3.6-8

Second Reading Col 2:12-14

Gospel Lk 11:1-13

17TH SUNDAY OF YEAR: The first reading and Gospel today have a common theme – persistence in prayer. The story of Abraham driving a hard bargain with God in order to save any innocent people living in Sodom seems like a scene from an oriental market. We should not think of a cruel God being persuaded to change his mind. God is not unjust. Unlike Abraham he knows that in fact not a single innocent person will be found in the town. It is more a question of Abraham adjusting his expectations. When one of the disciples asks Jesus to teach them how to pray, the Lord does two things. First he sets out a model of prayer – the kind of things we should pray for – and then he insists on the importance of persevering when we don't receive an instant answer. He also points out in a subtle way that prayer is in fact always answered but not necessarily by giving us what we ask for. Sometimes we ask for something that we believe is for the best, but God sees things differently. We will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit who will help us, over time, to understand God's purpose.
