TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF YEAR

If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself.

First Reading: Jr 20:7-9

Gospel: Mt 16:13-20



22ND SUNDAY: Last week we heard how Jesus entrusted the power of the keys to St Peter, but today he has to rebuke him. Peter thinks in terms of an earthly kingdom. He cannot comprehend that God's plans include the cross for Jesus or martyrdom for himself and the other disciples. That temptation faces all of us. Until Pope Paul VI laid aside the Papal Tiara, Popes were crowned at the beginning of their reign but carried in front of them by a Franciscan Friar was piece of smoking flax, who chanted the words 'Sic transit Gloria mundi' – 'Thus passes the glory of the world'. A symbol can be laid aside but the temptation remains to take the short cut of using human power rather than the way of love and persuasion. Sometimes this may be necessary for the good of others but it should always be the last resort. Do we like to exercise power, to say 'yes' or 'no' to people just to show who is in control?

'DAILY, DAILY SING TO MARY': Did you know that the words to this hymn were written by a parish priest of Kelvedon? Fr Henry Bittleston was a convert, received into the Church by Newman in 1849, who tried his vocation at the Birmingham Oratory and wrote the hymn in 1850. He left the Oratory to try his vocation as a Carthusian monk in 1879 but this did not work out and he became a priest of Westminster Diocese in 1880. He worked with Fr Bampffield and his fledgling Institution of St Andrew who had established a Catholic School and Mission in Kelvedon in 1875. He took up residence in Kelvedon in 1880 and became headmaster of the school but left for St Albans in 1881 when the Institute of St Andrew withdrew from the school. He died in 1886 and was buried in St Alban's cemetery.
