Most Holy Trinity

*Everything the Father has is mine all the Spirit tells you

TRINITY SUNDAY: The human mind cannot comprehend what it is like to be God. It is hard for us to understand the relationship between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. St Athanasius wrote the following in explanation. “When Saint Paul was writing to the Corinthians about spiritual matters, he traced all things back to one God the Father as the fountain-head in these words: ‘Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one’. The gifts which the Spirit distributes to individuals are given by the father through the Word. For all things which belong to the Father likewise belong to the Son: so that those things which are given by the Son in the Spirit, are true gifts of the Father. Similarly when the Spirit is in us, the Word by whom we receive him is also in us, and in the Word is also the Father, and this is the meaning of the text: ‘We (that is, my father and I) will come to him and make our home with him.’ For where there is light, there is also brilliance, and where there is brilliance, there the power and the glory of the light shine out.” Another image we can reflect is that of speech. God the Father is the source of the thought that is expressed through the spoken word – God the Son. The Holy Spirit is the breath that makes it possible for that spoken word to be vocalised and heard.
