All mankind shall see the salvation of God.

First Reading Bar 5:1-9

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: Today St Luke, having spoken of the birth of Jesus in his first two chapters, turns to his public ministry and explains the role of St John the Baptist. In a comment on this passage Pope Benedict XVI notes the great trouble St Luke goes to over the date in order to show this is not just a legend but an historical event. There was no generally accepted system of dates and so he refers to the regnal years not only of the Roman Emperor, but also of local rulers and the high priests. John's role is to be the voice of the Spirit proclaiming that the day of salvation has dawned and the Saviour is close at hand. It is a time of hope and joy but before that the Spirit must transform human lives and remove the obstacles to divine grace.
